

WELCOME

Welcome to the schools programme at the Royal Navy Submarine Museum and Explosion Museum of Naval Firepower.

Come to the Royal Navy Submarine Museum and step on board the UK's only surviving World War Two era submarine, HMS Alliance and discover more about what it was like to live beneath the waves.

Join our submariner guides who will describe what life was like on HMS Alliance. Experience the submarine's interior which contains the belongings and the recreated sounds of the crew. This atmospheric experience provides inspiration for history, science, creative writing and art in particular.

Or visit Explosion Museum of Naval Firepower to make your school visit go off with a bang! There is plenty of science to discover with 150 years of naval firepower and changes in military technology. If you are focusing on history, a visit to Explosion will bring to life the site's rich local heritage, including a chance to investigate the Grand Magazine from the time of Nelson's Navy. Discover more about the lives of the women who worked at Priddy's Hard during both the First and Second World Wars.



DISCOVERY VISITS

A Discovery Visit is a teacher led self-guided museum visit.

We are excited to be able to offer you a choice of Discovery Visit supported with new Discovery Challenge packs for pupils and teacher guides. There is plenty to see in our galleries.

These trails can be downloaded from our website before your visit and are free when you book a Discovery visit. They offer teachers a pick and mix of challenges that will support different ages and abilities. There will be a choice of two options depending on which Discovery visit you have booked.

THE ROYAL NAVY SUBMARINE MUSEUM

The hands-on learning in the interactive science of submarines gallery is complemented by our history galleries. Holland One, the Royal Navy's first submarine, makes a good comparison with our Second World War era submarines, offering a sense of how technological developments shaped the world. The Modern Submarines gallery explains Britain's role and place in the world during the Cold war and as Gosport was the home of the Submarine Service there are links to local history.

TOURS OF HMS ALLIANCE

During the summer season, due to high demand, groups are allocated a 30 minute time slot on HMS Alliance with an introduction by our guides plus other guides are stationed throughout the boat to offer assistance.

EXPLOSION MUSEUM OF NAVAL FIREPOWER

Pupils will be able to see the original Powder Magazine dating from 1771, explore the stories of those who worked at Priddy's Hard and wonder at the size of the big guns and shells used during the First and Second World Wars. A visit cannot fail to make an impression on pupils' understanding of what conflict really means and the consequences it can have.

NEW - THE NIGHT HUNTERS: THE ROYAL NAVY'S COASTAL FORCES AT WAR

In a brand new permanent gallery The National Museum of the Royal Navy pays tribute to the small band of young, courageous men, often reservist volunteers, who manned the wooden craft which were heavily armed, carrying ammunition, explosives and high-octane fuel as they went in to attack enemy naval forces at close range.

NEW DISCOVERY VISITS



New for 2022 we are offering a choice of two types of Discovery Visit:

ALL HANDS ON DECK

Target Group: KS2/3

Curriculum Links: Local History Enquiry.

Sail through time with the Royal Navy. What role did the Royal Navy have in times of peace and conflict? What do the people, the places and the artefacts tell us about how lives were lived in the past? How did people experience major events? What jobs did they do? This Discovery visit will encourage pupils to use their historical enquiry skills to explore our unique collection. Pupils will be able to use our Discovery Challenge pack to become investigating historians. They will work through various activities making links, arguing using evidence, debating different perspectives, telling stories, comparing sources and problem solving. Pupils will have fun with this hands-on and minds on experience.

NAVAL GAME CHANGERS - OBJECTS THAT CHANGED THE WORLD

Target Group: KS2/3

Curriculum Links: Local History Enquiry: Science: Design & Technology

Discover the Royal Navy's game changing use of science and technology and who were the inspired pioneers behind it. What do the people, the places and the artefacts tell us about how lives were lived in the past? This Discovery visit will encourage pupils to use their problem - solving skills to explore our unique collection. Pupils will be able to use the Discovery Challenge pack to work through various activities making links and arguing using evidence to explore the objects and people that changed the world.

The Challenge Packs can be downloaded from our website before your visit and are free when you book a Discovery Visit. They offer teachers a pick and mix of challenges that will support different ages and abilities.

DISCOVERY CHEST

A teacher led pupil friendly activity station with resources designed to help with discussion, investigations, reflection, and creativity. Inside each of the Discovery Chests will be useful hands on equipment, including torches, magnifying glasses, thinking dice, object handling, and prompts.

The Discovery Chests will also have helpful hints to support in gallery learning.

Royal Navy Submarine Museum: Submarine Science

Explore the science behind designing, building and living on board submarines with a range of hands-on activities to challenge and inspire.

Explosion Museum: Priddy's People

Discover more about the stories of people who worked at Priddy's Hard throughout its history in particular the women who worked there during the two world wars.

Discovery Chests are available exclusively for your school visit and are located in our galleries at the Royal Navy Submarine Museum and at Explosion Museum.

SPECIAL EDUCATION NEEDS AND ACCESS PROVISION


Hand-held audio devices describing the collection are available by prior arrangement, for booked groups of people with visual impairments. The buildings are wheelchair accessible with accessible toilets and a lift. HMS Alliance is partially accessible for wheelchair users. We can provide wheelchairs, handling artefacts, trails or activities for those with learning difficulties or other types of needs. You can also book a Chill Out Backpack designed to support visitors with sensory needs or who need extra support to feel grounded and relaxed. Please discuss these with us beforehand.

TEACHERS GUIDE

The teachers guide is a pdf booklet and will be available to download for free from our website. It will include information on each individual attraction, maps to help you find your way around our sites and must-see highlights to get the most out of your visit.

PRELIMINARY VISITS

We strongly recommend you to come on a preliminary visit so that you can familiarise yourself with the site and complete your risk assessment paperwork. Preliminary visits are free of charge but school identification such as headed paper or your booking form is required.



LUNCH FACILITIES

Spaces to eat your packed lunches are available and can be booked in advance. We will provide bin bags so that you can ensure areas are tidy afterwards.
