



These are the regulation Submarine Drawers. They are certainly proof against the coldest weather, and they don't take long to knit.

MATERIALS

Sirdar Knitfast Wool. 1 lb. 12 ozs.
2 each No. 11 and No. 8 knitting needles.
Three $\frac{5}{8}$ in. bone buttons.

To obtain the best results, it is essential to use the exact materials mentioned above.

MEASUREMENTS

Length, 46 inches. Leg seam, 27 inches.
Width round widest part, 40 inches.
For abbreviations, see page 18.
Always k. the first row into back of sts.
Tension of knitting about $5\frac{1}{2}$ sts. to 1 inch.

THE RIGHT LEG

USING No. 11 needles, commence at waist by casting on 92 sts. K. in a rib of k. 2, p. 2 for 5 inches. Change to No. 8 needles. K. in st.-st. for 4 rows. **5th row**—K. 4, inc., k. to end. **6th row**—P. **7th row**—K. **8th row**—P. to last 5 sts., inc., p. 4. **9th row**—K. **10th row**—P. Rep. rows 5 to 10 inclusive 8 more times. (110 sts.)

** Continue in st.-st. without further shaping till work measures 19 inches from beginning, finishing after a p. row. **Next row**—K. 3, dec., k. to last 5, s. 1, k. 1, p.s.s.o., k. 3. K. 3 rows in st.-st. Rep. last 4 rows 12 times. (84 sts.) Continue in st.-st. without further shaping till work measures 36 inches from beginning, finishing after a p. row. **Next row**—K. 3, dec., k. to last 5, s. 1, k. 1,

p.s.s.o., k. 3. K. 5 rows in st.-st. Rep. last 6 rows 5 times. (72 sts.) Change to No. 11 needles and k. in a rib of k. 2, p. 2, for 5 inches. Cast off in rib.

THE LEFT LEG

Using No. 11 needles, cast on 92 sts. and k. in rib of k. 2, p. 2, for 1 inch. **Next row**—Rib 12, turn. Rib 2 more rows on these 12 sts. Cut wool. Re-join wool and rib 3 rows on rem. 80 sts. Continue in the rib across all the sts. for another 3 inches, finishing at same edge as buttonhole. Work another buttonhole exactly as before, then rib one or two rows right across till work measures 5 inches, finished at buttonhole edge. Change to No. 8 needles and k. 4 rows in st.-st. **5th row**—K. to last 5 sts., inc., k. 4. **6th row**—P. **7th row**—K. **8th row**—P. 4, inc., p. to end. **9th row**—K. **10th row**—P. Rep. from 5th row twice more. **23rd row**—K. 12, turn. **24th row**—P. 12. **25th row**—K. 12. Cut wool and re-join to 83 sts. **23rd row**—K. to last 5 sts., inc., k. 4. **24th row**—P. 84, turn. **25th row**—K. 84. **26th row**—P. 4, inc., p. to end across all the sts. **27th row**—K. **28th row**—P. Rep. from 5th to 10th rows 5 times. (110 sts.) Finish as right leg from.**

THE GUSSET

Using No. 8 needles, cast on 22 sts. and k. in st.-st. for 4 inches. Cast off.

TO MAKE UP

Press on the wrong side under a damp cloth with a hot iron. Join the legs from the beginning of the decs. to lower edge. Next join the two shaped edges together. Leave the two straight edges open for about 14 inches from the top, then join for 2 inches. Sew in the gusset. Fold under and hem 4 sts. all round the front opening. Press

seams. Work each buttonhole with stitching. Sew buttons on right side to correspond with buttonholes.

Cable-Stitch Pullover

29th row—Knit this row in rib, but working the cable-stitch on each 6 plain stitches.

30th row—Knit in rib. Repeat from ** 5 times (120 sts.). Here shape for top.

Next 16 rows—Cast off 3, knit in rib to end.

Next row—Cast off 3, knit in rib, working the cable-stitch on each 6 plain stitches. **Next 9 rows**—Cast off 3, knit in rib to end (34 sts.). Cast off.

THE NECK BAND

Using No. 12 needles, cast on 2 stitches.

Always slip the first stitch purlways throughout neck band.

1st row—S. 1, k. 2 into last st.

2nd row—S. 1, k. 2. **3rd row**—S. 1, k. 1, k. 2 into last st. **4th row**—S. 1, k. 3.

5th row—S. 1, k. 2, k. 2 into last st.

6th row—S. 1, k. 4. **7th row**—S. 1, k. 3, k. 2 into last st. **8th row**—S. 1, k. 5.

9th row—S. 1, k. 4, k. 2 into last st.

10th row—S. 1, k. 6.

11th row—S. 1, k. 5, k. 2 into last st.

12th row—S. 1, k. 7. Knit in garter-stitch (i.e. every row plain) until band measures sufficient to go round neck of pullover, working an even number of rows.

Next row—S. 1, knit until 2 remains, k. 2 tog. **Next row**—S. 1, knit to end. Repeat last 2 rows until all stitches are worked off.

TO MAKE UP

Press work on wrong side under a damp cloth with a hot iron. Sew up under-arm, shoulder and sleeve seams, sew in sleeves, placing sleeve seam level with under-arm. Join neck band and sew to neck. Press all seams.
